Rector's Message continued...

I recognize that this is challenging, and often seems impossible, in a world that demands so much of us. We will all have so many things to do this December. But at the very least, let us try to embrace the opportunities available to us—small moments to stop, breathe, reflect, and pray.

Beyond the four Sundays of Advent, we can take time each week to pray with the Advent wreath at home, perhaps lighting it before the main family meal and taking a few moments of silence. We can also use the Advent devotional provided by the church, setting aside a daily moment for prayer—either alone or with family. We can set aside time for silent prayer, or reading the lessons from the daily office.

Additionally, there are two special services designed to help us pause and reflect before and during Advent. The Thanksgiving Eve service, on November 27, which offers a time to express our gratitude for God's blessings, and the Blue Christmas service, on December 19, which is especially designed for those of us who find it hard to rejoice due to the challenges in our lives, society, or the world.

We all need moments to pause, reflect, and pray, and this is even more crucial during the busy month of December in order to enjoy the gift of the Advent season, and be spiritually ready for the celebration of Christmas.

Worship Assistants are needed for all of these services.








December: Angel Tree


Youth Sunday




Thanksgiving and Giving

 - a. The meeting began at 6:33pm.

 - b. Prayer: Began with a Prayer for the Mistletoe Mart.
- 2. Approval of Consent Agenda and Finance:
 - i. Motion Approved to accept the Consent Agenda: Vestry Meeting Minutes (September 24, 2024), Resolutions 2024 YTD- September, Mistletoe Mart Report
 - In the minutes for Old Business, Updated Guidelines, Expenditure Approval Process. Need to insert the following wording between paragraphs 1. i.) a.1. and
 Paragraph "Expenditures between \$1,001 and \$1,499, committees need to obtain only one quote and present it to the Rector and Senior Warden"
 - 2. Edit to the Leadership Reports, Jr. Warden, paragraph b.1. i.) b. 1. 3.). Thomas Roofing should read "@\$250 \$5,000" (not \$8,250).
 - 3. Edit to the second set of 2.a. replacing Plague with Plagues.
 - ii. Motion by Roberta Wilhelm. Second by Gary Lang. Unanimously approved.

 - i. Financial Statements for September, YTD \$61,000 negative.
 - ii. Human Resources look slightly higher due to Medicare 4th quarter was paid in September.
 - iii. Middendorf Loan anticipates a remaining balance of \$26,672.00. Current Actual Balance of \$39,642.00.
 - b. Budgeting Process (Debbie B.)
 - i. Once October is closed and reconciled Deb will send out to ministries asking for their anticipated budgeted expenses and income for the year.
 - ii. We plan to have a budget by the end of December.
 - iii. Motion Approved to approve the Financial Reports Motioned by Beverly Baker, Second by Kim Tompkins. Unanimously approved.
 - c. Finance Committee met with Dina VanKlaveren from the diocese
 - i. Many new ideas on fundraising and use of the building.
 - ii. It is important to communicate to the congregation and others our needs and what we do. Such as transparency with cost to run the building.
 - d. 2025 Shared Ministry Allocation *See attached image titled the same
 - i. The increase was only \$250 in comparison to previous years.
 - ii. The total amount for 2025 is \$34,027, or monthly \$2,835.58.

- iii. The document will not be signed and returned until the deadline so that we can have a full financial picture of our budget before making payment. This was recommended by Dina.




